

SHRUB PRUNING SCHEDULE - RENOVATION STYLE

Summer Flowering Plants		Prune in cooler months. prune only the amount equal to one season of growth. Reduction in size by no more than 2/3. If planting space is adequate. The plant may not need to be pruned at all. Plants arranged in hedges should be allowed to grow together to provide a continuous mass. Evaluate carefully and prune only as needed.
